What is it like working in the Floating LNG industry?

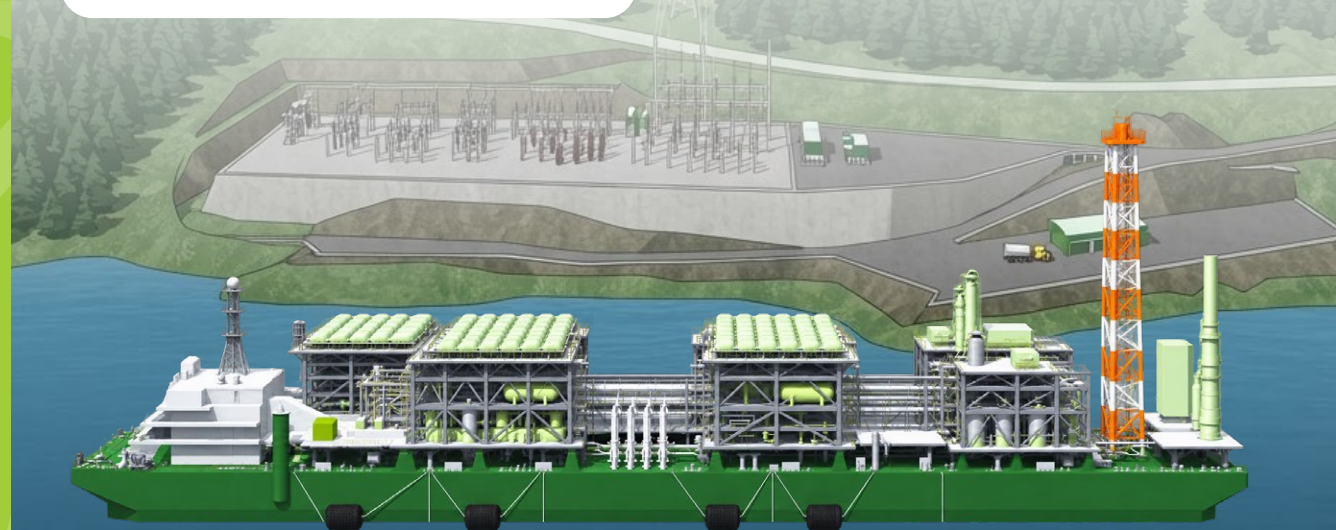
- **Competitive entry-level wage**, that increases as you become a certified Journeyperson.

What is an Apprentice?

An apprenticeship allows you to build skills and complete your required certifications, while working on the job.

As an Apprentice, you will gain the right training, and experience, alongside a team of mentors, to be able to pursue a career as a certified tradesperson. During your apprenticeship, you are paid from your first day, and attend your classroom training in 7-10 week blocks each year, depending on the trade.

After a few years you can be a fully certified tradesperson making good money.

Working on Water is Different – Here's what you can expect

A marine worksite runs on maritime rules, not standard land labour law, including Transport Canada requirements. These are not established by Cedar LNG, but by law.

Technical Requirements — this training supports safety, progression, certification, code compliance, and long-term career mobility.

Safety Training — training in emergency response, survival, and safety drills is mandatory before you step aboard.

Drug & Alcohol Testing — all team members must clear drug and alcohol testing to be declared fit for duty.

Rotational shift pattern — you live and work on the vessel during your rotation, then have dedicated time off.

Prepare for Your New Career: Minimum Requirements

Before beginning your career in Trades, you'll need to meet these requirements:



High school English, Math and Science (varies by trade)



Pass Drug & Alcohol Test



Register with Skilled Trades BC



YEARS 1-4

Apprentice Tradesperson

Gain paid experience and work towards getting your red seal certification.



Four 7-10 week Technical Training blocks at accredited school, or you can get started with a 6 month Foundation program



Paid work experience



Safety certificates

Earning Potential: Competitive entry level pay that increases as you progress



Obtain your Red Seal Certification

Pass the national certification exam to become a Journeyperson.

As a fully qualified Journeyperson, you can continue to grow within your career.

Instrumentation & Control Technician

You keep processes running safely and precisely — maintain the sensors and control systems that measure and manage temperature, pressure, and flow throughout the liquefaction process.



Millwright/Industrial Mechanic

You keep heavy machinery running — maintain the compressors, turbines, pumps, and cryogenic equipment that physically turn gas into liquid.



Industrial Electrician

You keep the power on — maintain the vessel's power generation, distribution, and motor systems that everything else depends on.
